

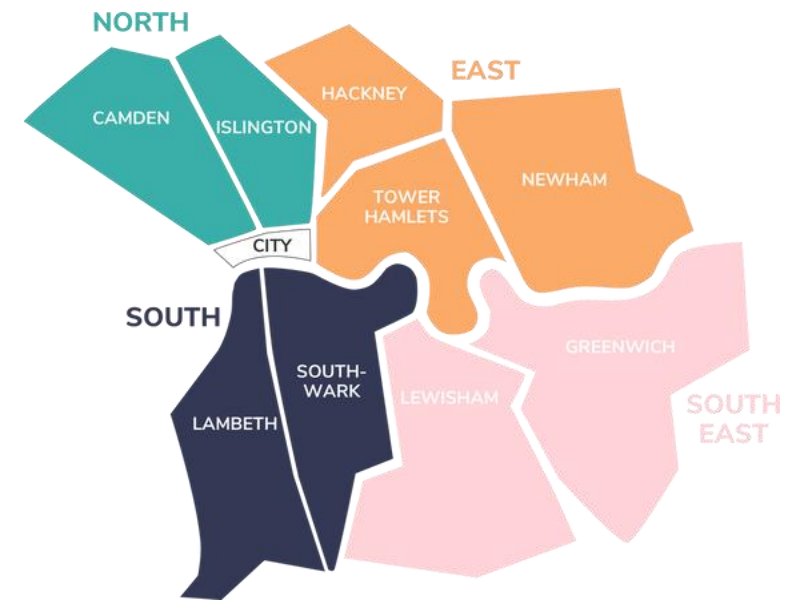
SENIOR YOUTH WORKER BUS PROJECT (TWO ROLES - SOUTH EAST AND EAST)

XLP is a youth work charity working to create positive futures for young people in inner London. We deliver holistic long-term youth work with young people aged 11-25 in schools and estate communities. We believe positive, long-term relationships can restore a young person's trust in people, nurture the belief that things can change and encourage them to set positive goals and work hard to achieve them.

The XL-Buses project provides a unique and rare platform to engage with young people on some of London's most deprived estates on a weekly basis.

These mobile youth centres enable a team of experienced youth workers to provide a range of services for young people. Whether table tennis or trivial pursuit, cooking or competitions, games consoles or group discussions, FIFA or Forza, we use our buses to help London's young people create their positive future. We pride ourselves on being able to provide a safe and consistent environment where young people can grow. We use our vans and buses to offer them further opportunities to gain new experiences and develop their skills, helping them create their positive futures.

These Senior Youth Worker – Bus Project roles are for youth workers that also drive one of our buses. These roles reports directly to the Youth Work Manager - Outreach and work closely with the Senior Youth Workers in Greenwich and Lewisham (South East), and Senior Youth Workers in Hackney, Tower Hamlets, Newham and the Olympic Park (East).

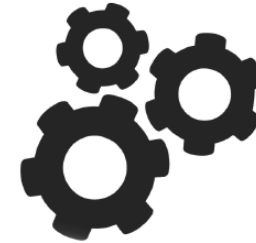

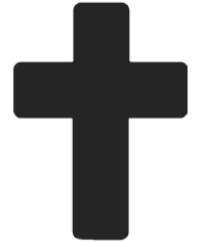

KEY TASKS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Youth Work

- Delivering the youth work personally, including regular weekly sessions, activities and trips;
- Working with the Senior Youth Workers and Youth Work Managers to identify the types of activity that are appropriate to the context of each location / estate;
- Home visits to families delivering 1:1 support sessions;
- Helping the team to create appropriate 1:1 relationships with young people and their families;
- Delivering detached estate-based youth work.

Leadership and Management

- Working with the Volunteer Manager, and Senior Youth Workers to lead, motivate and support teams of volunteers, interns and degree students to deliver the work within their respective areas;
- Monitoring and supervising the team member's activities, feeding back positive encouragement where appropriate, and working with them to address and overcome any issues or challenges.

Operations and Safeguarding

- Detailed planning and coordination of all the bus facilities and the programme of activities for your assigned projects;
- Regular driving of the bus to and from its base of operations and the estate locations;
- Ensuring that all project activities for which you are responsible are delivered in accordance with agreed health and safety, equal opportunities and safeguarding, policy and procedures.

Development

- Identifying new opportunities to enhance or develop the provision, taking a key role in the planning and development of new activities and locations, in your boroughs;
- Developing project resources and building team to deliver the project to our beneficiaries effectively and efficiently;
- Complete appropriate training relevant to the context of the project and support the delivery of training alongside the Outreach Youth Work Manager when required.

Reporting

Key Stakeholder Management

- Ensuring that quality and performance monitoring information is gathered and reported in a timely manner and is used continually to assess where improvements can be made to project delivery;
- Undertaking community surveys to assess the local impact of the project.
- In collaboration with the Youth Work Manager, developing effective relationships with community stakeholders and other organisations (including councillors, teachers, the police, church leaders, youth leaders, parents and young people);
- Liaising with other agencies that may complement or extend the work XLP provides.

- You will have strong project management skills;
- You will be able to relate easily to young people and the complex challenges and issues they face;
- You will be highly motivated and have good leadership and networking skills;
- You will be skilled in energising and mobilising volunteers and know how to get the best out of those working with you;
- You will enjoy taking initiative and love working as part of a dynamic team;
- A relevant youth work related qualification is highly desirable.
